Services for Mary ¹¹⁻¹⁸⁻¹⁹⁹⁸Mildred Adams, 96, were held Saturday, November 21, at the Platte Funeral Chapel in Wheatland, Wyo., with Pastor Gordon Swedberg officiating. Interment was in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mrs. Adams died Wednesday, November 18, at the Platte County Memorial Nursing Home in Wheatland.

Mildred was born May 17, 1902, in Norris City, Ill., the daughter of George W. and Emma Hardesty. She was reared and educated in Norris City; graduating from Norris City High School. Mildred married Freddie Lee Adams November 16, 1920 at Evansville, Ind. They moved to Evanston, Wyo., where Mildred began working in mental institutions. She also worked in Idaho, Washington, California and returned to Wyoming. They bought a farm southwest of Wheatland in 1927 and settled permanently in 1930; retiring to Wheatland in 1963. Mildred was a member of the First Christian Church, a 50 plus-year member of Eastern Star, Rebekah Lodge and several other clubs in Wheatland. She enjoyed gardening, sewing, cooking, fishing, camping and reading.

Mildred is survived by several nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her parents; husband, Freddie; two infant children; and a sister, Audrey Hardesty Harris Cox.
