Services for Norma Ann Addison, 64, were held Saturday, May 29, at 10 a.m. at the United Church of Christ in Wheatland with Reverend Les Ludlum officiating. Interment was in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mrs. Addison died Tuesday, May 25, at the United Medical Center in Cheyenne. Norma was born November 28, 1934, in Terry, Mont., the daughter of Maurice and Mabel (Crinklaw) Madden. She was reared and educated in Terry and upon graduation began working in Billings, Mont. for Mobile Oil Company. Norma married John B. Addison on July 21, 1956 in Dallas, Texas where Norma had relatives. They returned to Montana for a time but, due to John's work, they traveled all over the world, including Bolivia, Egypt and Argentina.

In September 1978, they moved to Wheatland when the power plant was being built and made Wheatland their home base.

Norma was a member of Chapter AW P.E.O., Study Club and United Church of Christ. Her interests were in playing bridge, sewing and crafts.

Norma is survived by her husband, John B.
