

ALEXANDER, JUNE HUFFMAN
August 29, 1885-January 21, 1960

Funeral services were held Saturday, January 24, in the Schrader chapel for Mrs. (O.G.) Alexander who succumbed in the Platte County Memorial hospital Thursday, January 21, following a month's illness. She suffered a coronary thrombosis on December 26. David Gustavon of Cheyenne was in charge of the services and interment, was in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mrs. Alexander was born in Kansas City, Kans., August 29, 1885, the third child of Alfred and Carrie Huffman. Because of her father's untimely death, she spent her girlhood on a ranch near Hyannis, Nebr. with an aunt and uncle. In 1903 she was united in marriage to Lewis S. Curtis, and in 1914, the couple came to Wheatland from Nebraska with their two young daughters, Marion (Mrs. R.J. Clouse, North Platte, Nebr.) and Edythe (Mrs. W.C. Graves) to make their home. Mr. Curtis passed away in 1926. In 1929, the deceased was married to O.G. Alexander, who preceded her in death in 1957.

She was a loyal and devoted neighbor and friend, and was becoming noted for her many paintings and drawings which she had exhibited at both county and state fairs, and for which she had received several awards. She was a Jehovah's Witness.

Besides her daughters, Mrs. Alexander is survived by a son, Robert B. Curtis of Torrington; three half-brothers and one half-sister; six grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.
