

ALLISON, RALPH GEORGE
May 2, 1904-November 29, 1964

Ralph George Allison, a well-known retired rancher, succumbed in the Platte County Memorial Hospital on November 29, 1964, following a lengthy illness.

The deceased was born in Hopkins, Mo. On May 2, 1904 to George Edwin and Minnie B. Whitten Allison. Prior to moving to the Wheatland area in December, 1942, he had resided in Bedford, Iowa. Ralph was a member of the AF & AM No. 50 of Hopkins, Mo., the Wyoming Stockgrowers Association and Farm Bureau. He served as County Commissioner for seven years before retiring because of poor health.

Funeral services were held at the Methodist Church in Wheatland on December 2 at 10:30 a.m. with Rev. Polson officiating. Burial was in the Wheatland cemetery. Casket bearers were Ray Howard, Robert Trenholm, Roger Mills, Russell Davis, Jack Cole and Jack White.

Many friends share the loss with the surviving relatives which include his wife Hazel Inez Allison; three sons, Eldon, Harold and Dean, all of Wheatland; two daughters, Mrs. Howard E.
