

BAKER, HARRY ELMER
August 9, 1888-July 30, 1914

The remains of Elmer H. Baker were brought here Monday for burial from Hood River, Oregon, where he was killed by railroad cars.

The young man was a son of Mr. and Mrs. R.A. Baker of Binford, and made his home in this county until about four years ago, when he, with his family, moved to Oregon where they have since resided.

He was employed as a railroad brakeman, and while switching near Hood River on Thursday of last week, he stumbled over a derail switch and fell in front of a moving car and his body was severed by the car wheels.

He is survived by his wife and two small children, a father, mother, four brothers and five sisters.

Funeral services conducted by Rev. Paxton were held in the Congregational church Monday afternoon, interment being made in the Wheatland cemetery.
