

BARRETT, RAYNOLD DAVID

November 1 1880-May 20, 1934

Raynold D. Barrett, 53-year old well-known Platte county rancher, passed away May 20th from tick fever. The deceased had become ill on May 9th but thought he was suffering from the flu. May 16th he became seriously ill and upon consulting a doctor found he was a victim of tick fever.

Mr. Barrett was born in York County, Nebr., November 1, 1880. At the age of 12 years, he moved with his parents to Maywood, Nebr. on a ranch. He was married to Miss Nellie Baker at Grand Island, Nebr. on March 20, 1906, and for a time after the marriage, they lived at Grand Island. In 1910 they came to Wyoming and he freighted from Dale Creek to the army maneuvering grounds at Pole Mountain. In 1911 the family returned to Nebraska and lived on a farm there until their return to Wheatland in 1919 and he has resided here since that time. Part of the time he lived on his ranch west of Wheatland and part of the time farmed on the flats. He had just moved his family to the ranch when he was taken ill.

Besides his wife, he is survived by six children: Mrs. Myrtle Davis, Edwin Barrett, Mrs. Agnes Kafka, Mrs. Lucille Kafka, Earl and Edwin Barrett; five sisters and brothers, Mrs. Myrtle Carrell, Mrs. Prudence Kistler, Mrs. Alma Weber, Mrs. Irene Babcock and Edwin Barrett; a step-mother, Mrs. M. Barrett.

Funeral services were held from the Baptist church Wednesday afternoon at 2:30 with Rev. C.F. Thomas in charge of the services. Interment was made in the Wheatland cemetery by the Lyla Watson Funeral Home.
