

Funeral services for Standly James "Jim" Beierle, 65, were held Friday, Aug. 15, 1997, at 2 p.m. at the Trinity Lutheran Church, 1004 Willow Street, in Wheatland, with Reverend David L. Anderson officiating. Interment was in the Wheatland Cemetery. Mr. Beierle died Tuesday, Aug. 12, 1997, in the emergency room of the Platte County Memorial Hospital in Wheatland.
