

BERAN, ANTON DAVID
January 26, 1871-February 3, 1951

Anton D. Beran, 80, who had resided in Platte county for 49 years, died Saturday, February 2, at a local hospital after an illness of three months.

He was born at Madison Lake, Minn. January 26, 1871 and came to this vicinity from Ord, Nebr. He married Emma Dushabek on June 1, 1897.

He was for years engaged in farming in the South Flats area and played an interesting part in the early life of Wheatland, having assisted with the erection of the first building in the town of Wheatland. Among the hobbies he enjoyed were fishing and boating.

He is survived by his wife Emma; two daughters, Mrs. Amelia Moulding of Wheatland and Alice Vasconcellos of Cheyenne; two sons, Wilmer of Wheatland and Paul of Hawaii; nine grandchildren and seven great grandchildren; three sisters, Mrs. Louis Dowark, Longmont, Colo., Mrs. Antonia Prohaska, Brooks Park, Minn. and Mrs. Kate Galler, Madison Lake, Minn.; and one brother, Frank Beran.
