

BLUNCK, GEORGE DENNIS
December 3, 1887-April 14, 1918

George Blunck was instantly killed about six o'clock Sunday evening. He was riding a young horse which got beyond his control and collided with another horse and fell, the rider going down beneath the horse. Mr. Blunck's neck was broken, as was also his shoulder, and he never moved again. Dr. Phifer was summoned and he hasten to the scene of the accident but life was gone forever. The accident occurred on the Osgood Johnson ranch on the Laramie river which Mr. Blunck was working this year.

The victim of the fatal accident was a young man of 30 years. He had resided in this vicinity for about 13 years and was held in high esteem by all who knew him. Living with him on the ranch were his father and brother. Funeral services were held from the Congregational church Tuesday afternoon, Rev. A.T. Evans officiating, and the body was laid to rest in the Wheatland cemetery. The sad accident brings forth many expressions of sorrow from scores of men, those who knew him best speaking in unstinted praise of his manly virtues and upright character.
