

BORRALL, OWEN R.  
September 16, 1882-May 1, 1918

Owen R. Borrall was born September 16, 1882, in Keokuk county, Iowa.

He came with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. F.C. Borrall, to Wyoming 22 years ago locating in Platte county.

Here he resided until his death on Wednesday, May 1, his age being 35 years, seven months and fifteen days.

The cause of his death was acute appendicitis.

Mr. Borrall leaves to mourn his departure, a father and mother; four sisters, Mrs. Charles Hightower, Mrs. G.H. Kuehner, Mrs. U.V. Combs, all of this city, and Mrs. Alice Sexton of Pasco, Washington. Two brothers and one sister await his coming to the other sphere.

Mr. Borrall united with the Methodist church in Wheatland in his 20<sup>th</sup> year. At the time of his death, as for several years previously, he was assisting his father in the management of the ranch 18 miles west of Wheatland.

Mr. Borrall had leased Mr. Kuehner's ranch and cattle, and was attending to the cattle when taken sick and despite every effort made, he sank rapidly into that long last sleep.

Mr. Borrall was intensely interested in the outcome of the present war and talked incessantly of the boys in the trenches---and the last words spoken to his mother and sisters was "Tell me about the boys in the trenches".

The funeral was held Friday, May 3, at the Christian church, Elder W.H. Frame, preaching the sermon. Appropriate music was provided by a quartette.

Interment was in the Wheatland cemetery.
