

BOWDISH, ROY DAVID
February 9, 1931-September 29, 1989

Funeral services for Roy David Bowdish, 58, were held Tuesday, Oct. 3, at the Platte Funeral Chapel in Wheatland with Pastor Gordon Swedberg officiating. Mr. Bowdish died Sept. 29 at Henry, Nebr. following a brief illness.

Mr. Bowdish was born Feb. 9, 1931 at Mitchell, Nebr., the son of Craig and Elmira (Lantis) Bowdish.

Mr. Bowdish and his family moved to Wheatland where he received his education. He then went to work for Hopkins Construction Co. in 1948, where he worked until 1963.

On July 22, 1949, he and Gladys Anderson were married in Torrington. In 1970, they moved to Douglas where they farmed and ranched until the spring of 1987, when they moved to Henry, Nebr.

Roy was an avid hunter and fisherman and loved the out-of-doors. He is survived by his wife Gladys, sons, Ernest Douglas of Wheatland, George Douglas of Henry, Nebr., and Bill Douglas of Puerto Rico, and a daughter, Jean Good of Lingle.

He is also survived by sisters, Lena Anderson, Zada Thomas and Ruby Lantis, all of Casper, Laura Poling of Wichita, Kans., Hazel Chapin of Wheatland, and brothers, Lawrence of Kaycee, Ralph of Casper, Floyd of Hayden, Colo., and Ed of Rock Springs.

He was preceded in death by his parents, a grandson and a twin brother.
