

BOWMAN, JOSEPH NATHAN SR.
October 19, 1885-March 22, 1948

Joseph Nathan Bowman, 63, died March 22 at his home, 18 miles north of Wheatland, after an extended illness. Born in Onawa, Iowa, Oct. 19, 1885, he came here from St. Joseph, Mo. and had made his home here since 1914.

He was a lifetime member of the Masonic lodge at St. Joseph, and was a A.P.C. committeeman for thirteen years. He belonged to the Christian church.

He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth Bowman; two sons, Earl and George of Dwyer; three daughters, Jessie Bowman of Douglas, Louise Tittle of Bellview, Colo., and Betty Winkler of Dwyer; a half-brother, Leonard Bowman of Tulsa, Okla.; a half-sister, Louise Ricketts of St. Joseph; and two grandchildren. He was preceded in death by one son, Joseph N. Bowman, who was killed in action in World War II.

Services will be held Friday at 2 P.M. at the Christian Church, Rev. J.E. McElroy officiating. Burial will be in the Wheatland cemetery and the Masonic lodge will conduct graveside services. The pallbearers will be Orvell Bridgemon, A.E. Hoffman, S.R. Mills, Oren Thompson, Leonard Call and Tot Vermilyea.
