

**BROWN, ROBERT CHARLES**  
**October 15, 193-August 15, 1985**

A memorial service for Robert Charles Brown, 71, who died Aug. 15 in Cheyenne, were held Aug. 19, at 10 a.m. at the United Church of Christ in Wheatland.

Brown was born in Colorado Springs, Colo., on Oct. 15, 1913, the son of Charles H. and Rose Brown. When he was 12 he moved with his family to Jackson where he received his education. After attending the University of Wyoming, he returned to Jackson where he worked with the Wyoming Highway Dept.

He had badge No. 1 when he started working with the Wyoming Game and Fish on June 1, 1940. He owned one of only two complete sets of stuffed Wyoming wildlife.

Brown and Esther Schroetlin were married July 22, 1965 in Custer, S.D. He remained with Game and Fish until his retirement in 1978 and spent his retirement years in Wheatland.

He was a 32<sup>nd</sup> Degree Mason and past Master of Lodge No. 48, a member of the Moose Lodge and a member of an organization of persons retired from Game and Fish.

Survivors include his wife of Wheatland, step-mother Josephine Brown of Pinedale, five daughters: B. Jeane Shaffer of Scottsdale, Ariz.; Carmen Lundy of Wilson; Luetta King and Sandra Holloway of Wheatland; and Edie Lawrence of Shoshone; one son, Robert Henderson of Marysville, Wash., and 15 grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents and one brother.
