

BURKE, ALLAN ALTON
September 13, 1914- January 16, 1984

Allan Alton Burke, 69, died Jan. 16 in Douglas, Wyo. Services were held in the Schrader-Prell Funeral Chapel, Jan. 19, with Reverend Ken Saunders officiating.

Burke was born in Becmer, Nebr. Sept. 13, 1914, the son of John R. and Olive M. Burke. At an early age he moved with his family to the Wheatland area where he grew up on the family farm. He joined the Civilian Conservation Corps in 1938 and helped construct the Guernsey State Park. He entered the U.S. Army and served briefly during World War II. Upon his discharge from military duty, he worked for various construction firms and was then associated with several local restaurants until ill health forced his retirement.

Survivors include three brothers; Harold Burke of Loveland, Colo., Roy Burke of Torrington, Neil Burke, Aurora, Colo.; and three sisters, Maxine Mitchell of Gering, Nebr., Eunice Angle of Evanston, Wyo., and Betty Carter of Torrington.

Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by five brothers and sisters.

An Allan Burke Memorial has been established in care of Pam Goertz with use of the funds to be determined by the family at a later date.

Burial was in the Wheatland Cemetery.
