

BUSH, ANTWINE

?-June 28, 1919

Antwine Bush, a farmer living about 2 ½ miles northeast of town, was instantly killed when struck by a thunderbolt last Saturday afternoon, about 2:15 o'clock.

He and his small son were shocking hay about 100 yards west of the house when the bolt struck him on the head, tearing his hat into little pieces.

The boy, who was working right beside his father, was not hurt at all, and it was he who summoned help from the house.

Mr. Bush has been a resident of this county for 12 or 13 years and has lived on the Wheatland flats for the past seven years.

He leaves a wife and five small children to mourn his loss.
