

BUTLER, LEONE V. ANDERSON

June 4, 1898-October 15-1953

Mrs. Leone Butler, 55, died in Wheatland last Thursday afternoon, October 15, after an illness of several months. Last rites were conducted at 2:00 p.m. Saturday at the Schrader chapel with the Rev. Alan Inglis and the Rev. J.B. Milstead in charge of an impressive service.

Interment was at the Wheatland cemetery and pall bearers were Robert Trenholm, Ben Cossman, Kenneth Brighton, John Phifer, Ed Ryand and Del Hahn.

Mrs. Butler was born in Valentine, Nebr. June 4, 1898, the daughter of Charles G. and Effie Bristol Anderson. She came to Wheatland in 1912, and throughout her years here was an efficient worker in her church and in the other organizations of which she was a member. Her affiliations were with the Congregational church, the Order of Eastern Star, Jobs Daughters (as counselor), O.E.S. Past Matrons and Business and Professional Women's club.

For 26 years Mrs. Butler was employed at the Stock Growers bank in Wheatland, and served as assistant cashier until her retirement early in the summer.
