

CAMPBELL, MARY MAE DAVIS
June 14, 1885-April 6, 1960

Wheatland and Platte county was deeply saddened Thursday morning upon learning of the death of Mary Mae "Davy" Campbell at the Platte County Memorial Hospital Wednesday night.

"Davy", as she was affectionately known by her many, many friends, had been ill for the past five and a half years, and for many of these years was bedridden; but she was always cheerful and never complained.

"Davy" was born in Eldora, Ill. On June 14, 1885, the daughter of Edward and Anna Davis. She first came to Wheatland in 1907 as a nurse in the Wheatland General Hospital for the late Dr. Fred W. Phifer. She enlisted in the army as a nurse during World War I. She then returned to Wheatland and was married to Joseph R. Campbell. She worked many years with Joe in a café which was located in the building now occupied by the Chieftain Café, later moving to the building occupied by Wards and then to the building now occupied by the Stockman;s Café next door to the Ramona theatre.

She was an active member of the Episcopal church, American Legion and VFW auxiliaries.

She is survived by her husband; two sons, Joseph A. of Oswego, Ore., and Charles of El Cajon, Calif.; three brothers, Virgil, Norman and Ira Davis of Fall City, Ore.; one sister, Mrs. Melvina Bull of York, Nebr.; and seven grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at 2 p.m. from the Episcopal church, with Rev. John W. Day, Jr. officiating. Interment will be in the Wheatland cemetery. Pallbearers will be Wm. R. Jones, Reuben good, Dr. G.H. Good, Robert Straw, G.O. Nixson and Dr. O. B. Wilson. It was her request that in lieu of flowers a memorial fund be given to the Heart Association.
