

**ED CARTER**

Funeral Services for Ed Carter, 69, who died Thursday, Nov. 15 at the Veterans Hospital in Cheyenne, were held at 10:30 a.m. Nov. 19 at the Schrader-Prell Funeral Chapel, Wheatland. Officiating were Delbert Dick and Scott Leonard.

Carter was born Jan. 21, 1915, at Fullerton, Neb., the youngest of seven children born to Charles and Cynthia Carter. He attended Doane College at Crete, Neb. and graduated in Forestry from Colorado State University in Fort Collins.

After serving in the Pacific Theater as a First Lieutenant during World War II, he moved to Wheatland where he purchased a farm southwest of town. On Nov. 27, 1947 he married Grace Mickle Eshom.

After leaving the farm he and Grace resided in town. For a time Carter was associated with the ASCS.

Besides his wife, he is survived by three sisters: Mrs. Robert Van Pelt of Lincoln, Neb., Mrs. D. J. Chiono of Phoenix, Ariz.; and Mrs. C. R. Stumpff of Wheatland; and the children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren of his wife.

He was preceded in death by his parents and by older brothers George and Lewis and a sister, Alice Carter.

He was a member of the Memorial Baptist Church.
