

CLACK, CHARLES FRANKLIN
March 17, 1890-December 3, 1964

Charles Franklin Clack, a retired Prosthetist, died suddenly at his home in Wheatland, December 3, 1964. Before moving to Wheatland in 1961, he had resided in Summerville, N.J.

Mr. Clack was affiliated with the A.F. & A.M. in Glasgow, Scotland, Scottish Rite Mason, and the Methodist church.
