

CLARK, HENRY

January 26, 1863-August 2, 1932

Wheatland and community was shocked Tuesday morning when the news of the death of Henry Clark, resident of this community since 1902, became known. Mr. Clark passed away that morning about 9:30 and the cause of his death was uremic coma. The deceased had been in failing health for the past ten years and his condition became critical Monday morning.

Funeral services will be held Sunday afternoon at the Methodist church at 2:30 o'clock. Rev. Dwight M. Kitch, pastor of that church, will preach the funeral sermon. Interment will be made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Lyla Watson Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Clark was born in Marysville, Kans. January 26, 1863. He lived at that place until 4 years of age when his parents moved to Marysville, Mo. From there he moved to Sheridan, Mo. In 1884, he came to Carbon, Wyo.

In 1886, he was united to Miss Melissa Owens of Sheridan, Mo., a schoolmate of that city and the couple made their home in Carbon until 1902. At that time they moved to Wheatland and resided on the present Martin Dodd farm northwest of Wheatland. In 1918 they moved to Wheatland and Mr. Clark became one of the members of the Farmer's Mercantile. In 1926 he severed his connections with this company and since that time has been retired.

Three children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Clark, two preceding him in death. Earl Henry died in infancy and Lt. Com. Bert Franklin passed away in 1923. The latter was at home with his family from the Navy and while on a trip through the Yellowstone Park was taken seriously ill and died.

He leaves to mourn his passing, his wife, one son, Lt. Com. Volney O.; two grandchildren; one brother, Dr. B.O. Clark of Milwaukee, Wisc.; three sisters, Mrs. Dowis of Sheridan, Mo., Mrs. Harry Antrim of Payette, Ida., and Mrs. Minnie Hunt of Sovereign, Canada.

Mrs. Volney Clark was notified of Mr. Clark's demise and she immediately got in touch with her husband who is on the U.S.S. Sircus, in the U.S. Navy. Mr. Clark was located at Puget Sound and was ready to leave for Alaska. It is not known at this time if he'll be able to come to Wheatland for the funeral or not. Mrs. Dowis has arrived here from Missouri and it is expected Dr. Clark will be in Wheatland in time for the funeral.
