

**Extended Illness Takes
Life Of "Whitey"
Clark On Jan. 20th**

An ~~extended~~ illness claimed the life of Lee Roy (Whitey) Clark, 65, Thursday, January 20, 1972 at the VA Hospital in Cheyenne.

Born July 22, 1906 in Kennebec, South Dakota, he was married to Laura Moore November 10, 1928 in Billings, Montana. In January of 1944 Mr. Clark enlisted in the Navy and served during World War II. He was discharged in November, 1945 and was a member of the VFW. In 1946 they moved to Wheatland and he worked as a mechanic for Hopkins Construction for several years prior to working for the County seven years ago. He and his wife also had the Rock Shop in Guernsey for seven years.

Surviving besides his wife, Laura, is one son, Larry of Port Angeles, Wash.; three brothers, Willard, Cheyenne; Frank, Ft. Collins, Colo., and Otis of John-sowdale, Calif.; one sister, Mrs. Emma Cooksey, Oakland, California and three grandchildren.

Services were held Monday, January 24, 1972 at 2:00 p.m. at the Schrader Chapel. Rev. C. W. Livers officiated. Interment was at the Wheatland Cemetery with Military services held at the graveside.
