

CLARK, MARIAM HURST
1859-October 10, 1916

For the second time in three months, death stalked into the Clark home, and laid his icy hand on one of its dear ones. Following close upon the death of her youngest son, Rahe, whose untimely death is still mourned by the community, the announcement Friday of the death of Mrs. Clark came as a distinct shock even to those who realized it was shortly inevitable. The death of this lovely Christian woman---whom to know was to love and admire---was caused by a malignant cancer. Everything that medical science could invent was done, but all effort proved unavailing and death came as a welcome relief from pain at 12:10 Friday morning.

Mrs. Clark was born in New York state, and was 57 years of age. She is survived by a brother, J.J. Hurst of Wheatland; two sisters, Mrs. E.N. Benedict of Wheatland and Mrs. Jas. Hackshaw of Denver, a son, Robert, and a daughter, Margaret, both of whom are at the family home in Wheatland.

The funeral was held Friday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, from the Congregational church, the Rev. A.T. Evans officiating. Interment was in the Wheatland cemetery.
