

CLARK, MIRIAM HURST
June 11, 1859-October 20, 1916

Mrs. Charles R. Clark died on Friday morning, Oct. 20, after a long illness. A few months ago she visited Denver physicians in the hope of securing relief and underwent operations which were unsuccessful, and she steadily failed until the messenger of a brighter day called her hence. Mrs. Clark was one of the most estimable women of Wheatland and many are the friends who mourn her departure and sympathize with the bereaved children who are left.

Miriam Hurst was born in New York June 11, 1859. In 1894 she was married to Chas. R. Clark who preceded her to the home above a few years ago. She was the mother of four children, two of whom, Robert and Margaret, survive her. One son, David Ray, died only three months ago. Besides the son and daughter, Mrs. Clark leaves a brother and a sister, J.J. Hurst and Mrs. E.H. Benedict of Wheatland, also a sister in Denver. When a young girl, she united with the church and became an earnest follower of the christian faith, having been for several years an active worker of the Congregational church of this city until her failing health kept her closely at home. She has been called upon to pass thru great sorrow which, no doubt, bitter as it may have seemed, had it's purifying effect in preparing her for the life beyond. Funeral services were held from the Congregational church, Rev. A. T. Evans officiating.
