

COBB, ADELINE ELEANOR MCCLELLAND

April 2, 1878-May 4, 1944

Last rites were held Saturday in the Methodist church for Mrs. Adeline Cobb, 66, who died last Thursday morning following a long illness. The Rev. W.W. Maxwell conducted the services, and Mrs. Robert Kuns, Miss Tess VanDyke, Ben Cossman and Lowell Clark, accompanied by Mrs. J.B. King, sang.

Adeline Eleanor McClelland was born April 2, 1878, on a farm near Page Center, Iowa. In early childhood she moved with her parents to College Springs, Iowa where she received her elementary education, and later entered the art department of Amity college where she completed her course with outstanding honors.

On April 21, 1896, she was united in marriage to John Albert Cobb. She was affiliated with the local Methodist church since the family moved here in the spring of 1908, except for a short period when they lived in Vermillion, S.D.

In addition to her husband, she is survived by five children, Lester Ellsworth of Wheatland; Mary Grace Moss, Crawford, Nebr.; John Eugene of Provo, Utah; Joseph Walter who is stationed with the American Red Cross unit at North Camp Hood, Tex.; and Albert, Jr. of the army air corps stationed at Lincoln, Nebr.; one sister, Mrs. A.N. Cook of Los Angles, Calif.; and ten grandchildren.

Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Schrader Funeral home in charge of arrangements. Active pallbearers included M.A. Thrasher, O.A. Libbey, Laurence Moulding, Frank Rumsey, Fritz Merbach and Don Mudd. Honorary pallbearers were Claud Norris, P.A. Shope, H.M. Small, Ben Franzen, Willis Stamm and C.A. Foster.
