

COCHRANE, DAVID

March 19, 1860-September 25, 1950

Funeral services were held for David Cochrane, former Wheatland merchant, at 2 p.m. Sunday at the Congregational church with Rev. W. James Hoare in charge of the service. Cochrane died at Porter Sanitarium in Denver September 25, following a five-week illness.

Masonic graveside services were performed at the Wheatland cemetery where the body was interred. Pallbearers were L.B. Adams, Fergie Mitchell, Pete Weber, Charles Nelson, Paul Lawrence and David T. MacFarlane.

Cochrane, who was born in Scotland March 19, 1860, came to the United States as a lad of sixteen. He had resided in Wheatland from 1910 to 1946 where he was the operator of the Capitol Ice plant. He lived in Thermopolis since 1946.

He was a member of the A.F. & A.M. Masonic Lodge No. 16, of the Congregational church, and of the Wyoming consistory No. 1.

He is survived by the following nieces and nephews: David T. MacFarlane of Garrett, Jennie B. Atkinson of Rock River, Frank Prager of Garrett, and Mrs. Agnes Shaw of Casper.
