

# Frederick Corn

Frederick Beryl "Dutch" Corn, age 70 passed away Jan. 15, 1980, at the Platte County Memorial Hospital Nursing Wing. Funeral services were Jan. 18, at the United Methodist Church in Wheatland with the Rev. Virgil Lamm officiating. Interment was in the Wheatland Cemetery.
