Services for Mahlen B. Coulter, 69, were held Thursday, March 25, 1993, at 10:00 a.m. at the Platte Funeral Chapel in Wheatland, with Pastor Gordon Swedberg officiating.

Mr. Coulter died Monday, March 22, 1993, at the Platte County Memorial Hospital in Wheatland.

He was born January 2, 1924, the son of James Dewey and Martha (Cecil) Coulter, at Indianola, Nebraska. He was reared and educated in Nebraska while living on the family farm.

He moved to Wyoming in the early 1950's and worked for various highway contractors around the state and belonged to the Operating Engineer's Union.
