

CURTIS, ROBERT BURKE
May 1, 1918-March 14, 1968

Graveside services were held at the Wheatland cemetery Wednesday, Mar. 20, for Robert B. Curtis of Torrington. Mr. Curtis succumbed March 14 at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Denver following a long illness. He was born at Glendo May 1, 1918. A former resident of Wheatland, he had lived with his family in Torrington for the past 20 years. He was a carpenter by trade, and had served in the armed forces during World War II, doing a tour of duty in Japan.

The deceased is survived by his wife, Jacqueline; two sons, James G., U.S. Marines and Martin A., at home; three sisters, Mrs. W.C. (Edythe) Graves and Mrs. Herbert (Helen) Percy of Wheatland, Mrs. R.J. (Marion) Clouse, North Platte, Neb., a brother, Charles King of La Salle, Colo.; also seven nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. O.G. Alexander.

Mr. Curtis's son, Sgt. Jim Curtis who has been stationed in Vietnam for the past eighteen months, arrived in the States Tuesday for his father's services.
