

R. A. Cushing Dies At Ranch Home Sept. 3

Raymond Alonzo Cushing, age 77, succumbed at his ranch home 24 miles west of Wheatland, Sept. 3, 1970, after an extended illness.

He was born in Somerville, Mass. May 28, 1893, attended Boston University, where he was a member of Sigma Phi Epsilon, and was affiliated with the Methodist Church. He was a World War I veteran of the US Army, rank of 2nd Lt., and discharged April 21, 1919. He was married to Frances Bryant of Melrose, Mass. June 6, 1927.

He is survived by his wife Frances B. Cushing, two nephews, Alvin C. Pond, San Leandro, Calif. and Robert P. Jeans, Los Angeles, Calif.

Funeral services were at Schrader Chapel Tuesday Sept. 8, at 10:00 a.m. with Rev. Henry Hartberg officiating. Burial was in the Wheatland cemetery.
