## George S. Dawson Dies In Wheatland Monday Morning

George S. Dawson, 74, one of Wheatland's pioneer residents, passed away at his home in Wheatland on Monday morning, May 29, following a heart attack suffered last week.

Mr. Dawson was born in Denver, Missouri, August 31, 1864, the son of Mr. and Mrs. C. R. Dawson. He grew to manhood there and in 1888 was married to Nellie Brown. To this union four children, Faye Johnston, Luther, Claude and Harry were born. Faye and Luther preceded him in death.

Mr. and Mrs. Dawson moved to Grant City, Missouri, in 1896 and to the Goshen Hole country in 1916 where they homesteaded. In 1920 they moved into Wheatland where he operated the Cheyenne creamery until 1929 when he sold it. Since that time he had been associated with his son, Claude, in the live stock business. He was at one time county treasurer.

Mr. Dawson was a member of the Christian church, the Masonic and I. O. O. F. Lodges. Last September he and Mrs. Dawson celebrated their golden wedding anniversary.

Surviving are his widow, two sons, Claude and Harry of Wheatland, one brother, O. H. Dawson of Stansberry, Missouri, one sister, Mrs. Jake Hauber of Gregory, South Dakota, seven grandchildren, five great grandchildren and other relatives and friends.

Funeral services were held Thursday afternoon (today) at the Christian church at 2 o'clock with Rev. Hanna of Cheyenne officiating. The Odd Fellows had charge of services at the church and the Masons at the grave. Burial was made in the local cemetery with the Copley Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.
