

DEARINGER, ANNA MAY AGNEW  
October 16, 1889-August 22, 1945

Mrs. Anna May Dearing, who for many years lived in Wheatland, died Wednesday, August 22, at Basin, after an illness of several months. Until the death of her mother a year ago, she made her home here, but shortly after that left to be with her son, Hilton Dearing, Sp 1/c, who was then stationed in Des Moines, Ia. She returned in July to Wheatland and for a time was in the hospital here, later going to Basin for treatment.

Mrs. Dearing was born in Nodaway, Ia., October 16, 1889, coming to Wheatland in 1903 to make her home. She was a member of the Congregational church, the Dorcas society and the Order of the Eastern Star.

She leaves two sons, Hilton Dearing, Sp 1/c of Casper and Sanford Ph M 3/c of Hastings, Nebr.; a granddaughter, Sandra Dearing; four sisters, Mrs. Edith Day, Mrs. Jess Johnston and Mrs. Floss Hunton, all of Riverside, Calif., and Mrs. S.H. Whitney of Sunrise; two brothers, Frank Agnew of Los Angeles and Guy Agnew of Riverside, Calif.. Her parents, David Agnew and Florence Simpson Agnew, preceded her in death.

Last rites were conducted Sunday afternoon, August 26, at 2 o'clock from the Congregational church, the Rev. C.S. Higby officiating and Schrader Funeral Home in charge. Pallbearers were O.O. Natwick of Cheyenne, C.E. Artist, Arthur Rugg, Robert A. Ferguson, Reuben Good and James Chaplin. The O.E.S. was in charge of services at the Wheatland cemetery.
