Arthur Dover, well-known Halleck canyon ranchman, was taken to Laramie last Sunday by two neighbors, Wm. Irvine and H.C. Garlock, and in the district court at that place on Monday was adjudged insane and has been taken to the state asylum at Evanston.

Mr. Dover's troubles date back several years, during which time he has slowly grown worse. He has been patiently cared for by his wife, but recently his derangement became so pronounced that violence was feared and it was thought best that he be taken to Evanston, but little hope of his recovery is entertained, though he may possibly improve under treatment by the physicians.

Mr. Dover is an old resident and was one of the substantial and respected citizens of Albany county. He was at one time range foreman for the Swan Land & Cattle company, later taking up a ranch on Halleck creek, and by industry and thrift, had succeeded in well improving and stocking it. He has a wife and three young children, and to them the sympathy of the community goes out in their affliction.
