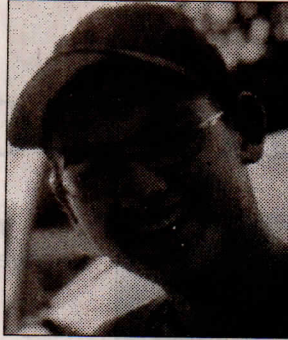
Mike passed through the Gates of Splendor into the presence of His Savior on Thursday, May 2, the result of a motor vehicle accident southwest of Wheatland.
