

FARNSWORTH, IDA MAE KING  
1881-September 30, 1943

Mrs. Ida King Farnsworth, age 62, died at the Wheatland General hospital Thursday (today) following a long illness. She had been confined to the hospital the past seven months.

She was born in 1881 in Silver City, Ia. and moved from there to S.Dak., coming to Wheatland in 1909 where she made her home until her death. In 1912 she was united in marriage to W.W. Farnsworth, and to this union, three children were born, King, Frank and Rose May who passed away in 1931. Her husband preceded her in death in 1927.

Survivors include two sons, King of the U.S. Navy and Frank of the Army Air Corps; one brother, Walter King of Wheatland; and three sisters, Mrs. Helen Frain of Carson, Ia., Mrs. Bertha Nordyke of Norfolk, Nebr. and Mrs. Mary Barber of Wessington Springs, S.D.

Funeral arrangements, which are in charge of Schrader's, are not complete at this time pending word from Frank. King is not expected home as his exact address is not known, and he was home recently on furlough.

Funeral services were conducted Sunday, October 3, at the Methodist church for Mrs. Ida King Farnsworth who died Thursday at the Wheatland General Hospital after an illness of many months. Rev. W.W. Maxwell officiated at the services, and burial was in the family plot in the Wheatland cemetery.

The Rebekah lodge, of which she was a member, attended the last rites in a body, and were in charge at the cemetery.
