

FAY, LOUISA HUNINGTON  
May 20, 1860-March 30, 1918

March 30-Lousia H. Fay, Age 57, Beloved wife of Benjamin C. Fay. Services were held from Pepper's Chapel Monday, April 1<sup>st</sup> at 2:30 p.m. Rev Kingman officiating. Interment Wheatland.

Wheatland people were grieved Saturday evening to learn that Mrs. B.C. Fay had passed away. While the loss was a shock to many, yet it was not a great surprise to those who knew of her critical condition following a grave operation for the removal of a far developed cancer. Mrs. Fay had been a silent sufferer for a number of months, but even her immediate family had no inkling of the serious nature of her trouble. When she sought medical advice, it was at once realized her condition was extremely critical. The operation revealed that the malignant growth was even more deep seated than at first feared, the entire system being affected, and death resulted five days later from uraemic poisoning.

Emma Louise Huntington was born in Penfield, N.Y., May 20, 1860. She came to the west in 1886, locating in Cheyenne. In 1891, she was married to Mr. B.C. Fay, the husband who survives her, together with their only son, Ralph. After their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Fay lived for six years on the Burdick ranch at Saratoga, moving to Wheatland 14 years ago. Mrs. Fay won the inevitable place in the esteem of a large circle of friends in the community. She was a charter member of the W.T.K. club of this city, and was active in many social and community interests. For many years, she remained a faithful member of the Baptist church in Cheyenne.

Funeral services were conducted on Monday afternoon by Rev. Kingman of the Episcopal church, the Congregational choir furnishing music. His high standing in the community was attested by the throng of sorrowing friends who called to pay their final tributes of love. Her body was laid to rest in the Wheatland cemetery, but the memory of her pure life and worthy deeds will live as long as friends remain here below. The sympathy of all is extended to the bereaved husband and son.
