

FISHER, NANNIE HARRIS STEVENS

October 12, 1870-May 3, 1916

Nannie Harris Stevens, daughter of Leroy and Mary Stevens, was born near Salem Ill. Oct. 12, 1870; died May 3, 1916, aged 46 years, 8 months and 21 days. In infancy her mother was called in the spent world, leaving her in the care of an aunt and uncle. Her aunt being an invalid, she was cared for by a colored servant, Fannie.

Aug. 6, 1896, she was united in marriage with Alexander W. Fisher. To this union four children were born: Georgia B. Austin of Salem, Ill., Milton E. Fisher and (unreadable) Davis, both of Wheatland, Wyo., Clarence S. having died in infancy. Besides her husband and children, she leaves to grieve her departure two grand children, one sister, two brothers, and a host of loving friends. She was kind mother and a loving friend to all.

At the age of (unreadable), she united with the Southern Methodist church at Salem, Ill., her membership remaining there. She will be sadly missed. No one can ever take her place, or nothing can satisfy the yearning for mother, but even her devoted family would not call her back for they realize that her ears are open to the harmonies of heaven and her eyes behold the beauties of that city which hath no need of the sun. The last three years of her life was a life of suffering, yet she suffered uncomplainingly, trusting in her Savior. Everything that loving (unreadable) and medical skill could do was done to relieve her until God saw fit to call her to His haven of (unreadable).

Funeral services were held on Saturday from the Wheatland Methodist church conducted by Rev. W.L. Wade, and the body was laid to rest in the Wheatland cemetery.
