**Ranchman Found With Broken Neck  
James Galligar Meets With Sudden Death.**

Jas. Galligar, a rancher living ten miles west of Wheatland, was found dead by his son, Julius, Tuesday afternoon. Mr. Galligar left the ranch house for a load of hay about ten o'clock in the morning, and not returning, search was made by the son who found the team standing in the river, and his father lying in the bottom of the hay-rack with his neck broken. The team had not been running and the supposition is that Mr. Galligar slipped and fell, striking on one of the cross pieces in the rack.

Mr. Galligar was one of the pioneers of Platte county, coming to this section about 42 years ago. He had lived on the ranch west of town since 1844 and is well and favorably known to most of the old timers of eastern Wyoming. He leaves to mourn his untimely death, a wife and two sons.

Funeral services will be held Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Methodist church.
