C. Robert Goetz was born north of Glendo, Wyoming January 20, 1923, the youngest of eleven children. His father worked for the B & N Railroad. Two years later the family relocated to Greeley, Colorado and got into farming. After five years they moved to Denver, Colorado.

Bob was active in sports, favored football in high school. He also developed a love for hunting and fishing.

After graduating, he entered the U.S. Army and served in the South Pacific and Philippines during WWII. After the war he returned to Casper and opened his own business then decided to join the police force in Boulder, Colorado.

After some time there he was accepted to join the Englewood Police Dept. where he worked until 1984. He always liked working with the law, arranged activity for teens, taught driving through the police department and served as a probation officer.

He returned to Wheatland, Wyoming in 1984, joined the sheriff's department and served as under sheriff. He then became Municipal Judge where he served until his sudden death. His life came full circle when he died in Wheatland in 2009.

Bob had two sons and a daughter who live in Colorado and Wyoming. He leaves his wife Gertrud.

He is interred at Fort Logan Cemetery in Denver.
