

GREENLEE, MILLS E.  
1852-1930

Mills E. Greenlee, 78, prominent rancher of the Chugwater section, died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Duncan P. Grant, 14 miles northwest of that town at 9 o'clock Wednesday morning, climaxing an illness which spread over a period of a year.

Hale and hardy up until a year ago, he underwent a gradual decline from that time on, and altho hope for his recovery had been abandoned for some time past, it was not until a week ago that his condition became critical.

Mr. Greenlee came to Wyoming from Iowa in 1905 and located on the farm which is still known as the Greenlee place, on the flats south of town. In 1914 he homesteaded the ranch he owned at the time of his death near Chugwater. He was born in Pennsylvania.

For the past year and a half with Mrs. Greenlee and their son Bert, he had resided with the Grant family.

Besides his wife, those who survive him are two sons, Bert and Ernest, the latter residing three miles north of Wheatland; three daughters, Mrs. Duncan P. Grant of Chugwater, Mrs. Viola Chase of Cheyenne and Mrs. Edna Billick of Gray, Ia.

Mr. Greenlee was a member of the I.O.O.F. lodge for some fifty years, affiliating with that body in Iowa in early manhood. Shortly after locating here, he joined the local lodge and was one of the oldest members in the point of membership on the roster of the order.

The hour for the funeral services has been set for 2 p.m. tomorrow, Friday at the Wheatland Methodist church, with Rev. Calvin of Chugwater officiating and the Wheatland I.O.O.F. conducting services at the grave.

Interment will be made in the local cemetery by the Longwith-Richards Funeral Home.
