

HADSALL, J.C.

?-June 29, 1911

A phone message was received in town yesterday (Thursday) forenoon that J.C. Hadsall had passed away early in the morning at his ranch home on the Bordeaux tract, death being caused by tuberculosis, from which disease he had been afflicted for several years.

J.C. Hadsall was one of the prominent residents of this section, being a civil engineer of rare ability. He moved to Wheatland from North Carolina several years ago, and until last fall, held the position of engineer for the Wyoming Development Company. He was also the engineer in charge of the installation of the town water, sewer and electric light systems.

The deceased is survived by a wife and young son, to whom the sympathy of the entire community is extended.

We have not learned as to the funeral arrangements.
