James C. Hall passes away in Cheyenne March 9 1987

Services for James C. Hall, who died in Cheyenne Memorial Hospital on March 9, 1987, were held in the United Church of Christ on March 12th at 2:00 p.m., with Reverend James Vuocolo officiating.

James Hall was born April 25, 1912 in Wheatland, Wyoming to Mr. & Mrs. H. Ralph Hall. The Hall family moved to Cuba Ranch in Albany County in 1913 and lived there for many years. Jim attended high school in Wheatland, graduating in 1931. He was an outstanding athlete. He returned to ranching, which was his life until retirement in 1972. He was a real old time cowboy, breaking and training horses.

He served in World War II in South Africa, Corsica, and Italy from January 1942 to September 1945. He was in the 321st Bomber Ordinance where he was awarded the Bronze Star and other

awards of meriterious service.

In 1946 he married Alice Starr and they ranched in Albany and Platte Counties until his retirement in 1972, when they moved to Wheatland.

He was predeceased by sisters Katie Dunlap, Carrie Michelsen, Ruth Thompson, Irene and Mary Small, one brother, Ralph A. Hall, and his parents.

He is survived by his wife, Alice Hall, son, Steve Starr, daughter, Georgia Richards, nieces, Sheila Dietz and Cynthia Small and nine grandchildren. Jim leaves many friends and other relatives who will remember him and grieve at his passing.

Burial was in the Wheatland Cemetery with the Schrader-Freif Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.
