Mabel Marie Hanes of 1157 Water St. passed away Sunday, Feb. 18, 1979 at her home.

Funeral services were held at the United Methodist Church in Wheatland on Tuesday, Feb. 20, 1979 with Rev. Virgil Lamm officiating. Interment was in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Serving as pallbearers were Joe Bookout, George Hassler, Richard Chase, Alan Utter, Rod Jones, and Del Landen. Schrader-Prell Funeral Home was in charge of the arrangements.

Mabel was born to George and Hattie Logan on Dec. 16, 1898 in Missouri where she was raised and educated. She and Fred Hanes were married Oct. 20, 1917 in Missouri and moved to Torrington in 1918. She cooked for construction crews with which Fred was employed.

The couple farmed for awhile and then in 1936 moved to Riverton where Fred was associated with the construction and plumbing business. Mabel worked for the Holly Sugar Company weighing beets. Prior to World War II the couple ran a hunting lodge on the Wind River Reservation and then went back to farming in the Riverton and Lander area.

In 1971 they moved to the Wheatland area until their retirement and have made their home in town for the last six years.

Mabel was a member of the Mountain View Farm Bureau Women's Club and the Wheatland Country Women's Club. She was also a member of the United Methodist Church.

She is survived by her husband Fred of Wheatland; one daughter, Mrs. Emerson Utter of Wheatland; two sisters, Fern White of Longview, Washington and Ruby Beardsley of Hawaii; six grandchildren; and 14 great grandchildren. She was preceded in death by one grandson.
