

HANNA, JOSEPH THOMAS DR.
1856-December 10, 1934

Dr. Joseph Thomas Hanna, long time resident of Platte County, died in his home at Chugwater Monday morning at 3:30. Dr. Hanna had not been in the best of health for some time, but his sudden demise came as a shock to his many friends and relatives.

According to information, he was suddenly stricken while in bed Monday morning and before his wife could determine what was wrong with him, he expired. Cerebral hemorrhage was given as the cause of his death.

Dr. Hanna was one of the best known men in the county as he had practiced as a doctor in various parts of the county and acted as a minister of the Gospel in the Dwyer and Chugwater communities. For the past several years, he has lived in Chugwater where he practiced as a physician.

Dr. Hanna was born in Linton, Ind., and was 78 years and 7 days of age at the time of his death. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Mary Catherine Hanna, and three sons, Dr. G.O. Hanna of Lingle; Clyde Hanna, Scottsbluff, and M.N. Hanna of Lingle. All of the sons are well known in this community

Funeral services are being held this afternoon from the Baptist church with Rev. W.L. Ripley, Denver minister and long time friend of the family will be in charge of the service. Rev. Charles F. Thomas, pastor of the local church, will assist him. Music will be furnished by the choir of the Baptist church in Chugwater. Interment will take place in the Wheatland cemetery with the Longwith Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.
