

HARTER, FRANK SIGEL
March 12, 1862-April 22, 1945

F.S. Harter, resident of this community since 1904, passed away at his home Sunday, April 22, following a long illness. Funeral services were held Wednesday from the Christian church at 2 p.m. with Mr. James Cameron officiating.

Frank Sigel Harter was born in Independence, Ia. on March 12, 1862. The family later moved to Akron, Ohio, where he studied to be a teacher, but the lure of the west struck and in 1884, he married Miss Ida Junie Davis and they moved to Nebraska where they took a homestead. To this union were born five sons, two preceding him in death. In 1904, he moved to Wheatland and in 1918, Mrs. Harter passed away. He later married Bessie Ray who preceded him in death in 1944. He was a member of the Christian church, Odd Fellows, Rebekahs, Sons of Union Veterans, and the Wyoming Bee Keepers association.

He is survived by three sons, Chester of Wheatland, Frank and Clyde of California; a brother, James H. Harter of Ohio; eight grandchildren and 14 great grandchildren.

Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Odd Fellows lodge in charge of the graveside services. Pallbearers included John Peters, Charles Woolsey, Ezra Davis, Charles Zohner, Don Mudd, and Harvey Coleman.
