

# Garland Dauzy Havely

*November 30, 1934 – August 20, 2004*

Graveside services and interment for Garland Dauzy Havely, 69, were conducted at 10 a.m., Tuesday, Aug. 24 in the Wheatland Cemetery at Wheatland, with Keith Geis officiating and military rites conducted by Veterans of Foreign Wars Laramie Peak Post #3558.

Garland passed quietly at home with his loving wife of 31 years at his side on Friday, Aug. 20 in Fort Collins, Colo.

Garland served in the Korean Conflict in the United States Army.
