HAVELY, HENRY DRAKE September 17, 1871-January 9, 1937

Henry Drake Havely, prominent Slater rancher, passed away in Wheatland, Saturday, Jan. 9, after a short illness of pneumonia complicated with heart trouble.

Mr. Havely was born in Argenta, Illinois, September 17, 1871, having reached the age of 65 years and a few months at the time of his death.

When but a small boy, he moved with his parents to Iowa, and grew to manhood on a farm near Kellerton, where he was united in marriage to Louie J. McConnell. Twelve children were born to this union, two having died in infancy. Mrs. Havely preceded her husband in death December 8, 1935.

In 1913 he homesteaded on the Slater Flats, where he resided until about three weeks ago when he moved to Wheatland.

Survivors include three daughters and seven sons: Mrs. J.E. Senevey and Otis Havely of Lingle, Mrs. C.M. Searl of Laramie, Worley of Manderson, Herbert of Slater, Ore., Dana, Mark, Lula and Seigal, all of Wheatland; also two sisters and four brothers: Mrs. I.J. Barnes, Lingle, Mrs. Frank Powers and William Havely of Eddyville, Iowa, Dr. J.M. Havely of Torrington, Dr. C.K. Havely of Tulsa, Okla., E.W. Havely of Henry, Nebr., ten grandchildren and one great grandchild. Besides these, he leaves a host of relatives and friends.

All of the children were in Wheatland for the funeral. Of his brothers and sisters attending were Dr. Havely of Torrington, E.W. Havely and Mrs. I.J. Barnes.

Funeral services were held at the Copley funeral home on Monday, Jan. 11. Elder Ed Anderson of Albin in charge of the services. Mrs. Vivian Landeen of Ft. Laramie and Mrs. Gladys Kynion of Lingle accompanied by Mrs. O.A. Libbey sang "Whispering Hope," "Beautiful Home," and "Wareham".

Mr. Havely was a member of the Reorganized church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints.

Interment took place in the Wheatland cemetery.
