

HAVELY, LELAND GLENN
January 15, 1938-November 29, 1952

A Boy Scout Thanksgiving holiday turned into tragedy Saturday afternoon when two boys were killed when the pickup truck in which they were riding skidded on a steep hill, 18 miles north of Mesa, Arizona, and turned over.

The dead youths were Leland Glenn Havely, 14, son of Mr. and Mrs. Dana A. Havely of Wheatland and Lynn Conley Lake, 11, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lynn Lake of Roberts, Idaho.

Both families were living at Lazona Trailer Park, a mile east of Mesa.

The truck in which the youths were riding when they met death was driven by Dwayne J. Brown, 16. Ten of the boys of the Boy Scout Troup accompanied by Wendel Martineau, assistant scout master and young Brown went to Sahuaro Lake. The dead boys and two others, wished to come home earlier than the rest. The remaining boys wanted to stay at the lake for "one more meal". Martineau stayed with them.

Brown told the sheriff's deputy that he put the pickup in second gear as he started down the hill, the rear end began to skid, and the truck went out of control, hitting a soft shoulder on the inside of the curve, turning over.

The deputy said the Havely families heard the sirens as they went past the trailer park and decided to follow. They were at the scene when the truck was lifted off their son.

Leland was born January 15, 1938, in Wheatland.

Services will be held Saturday at 1:00 p.m. at the Schrader Chapel.

He is survived by his parents and one sister, Mrs. Melving (Coleen) King.
