

HEADRICK, MARY MAGADELENE JAMESON

February 11, 1849-June 4, 1937

Mary Magadlene Headrick was born in Salem, Dent county, Missouri, February 11, 1849 and died in Wheatland, Wyoming, June 4th, 1937. She was the youngest and last of a family of eight girls and one boy.

Her parents were Samuel and Sarah (Carson) Jameson. They died during the Civil War, and she and her sister, Elon, made their home with a married sister until the marriage of Elon to Charles D. Griffin, after which she made her home with them excepting for seven years of her married life.

She married Philip Headrick in Kansas City, Kansas, December, 23, 1896. He died January 11, 1903. She came to Wyoming first in 1887 and the second time in 1903, and this has been her home since that time.

She was united with Christian church when sixteen years of age. One distinction in her family is that her great grandfather, William Harrison and great great grandfather, Colonel William Crawford, were burned at the stake by Wyandott and Deleware Indians, June 11, 1782, near the present site of Sandusky, Ohio. They were father and son-in-law.

Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon, June 6, at the Watson-Dennis Funeral Home chapel with Rev. Ralph Underwood in charge and burial was made beside her sister, Mrs. C.D. Griffin.
