

DON E. HENION  
February 3, 1936-September 27, 1984

Services for Don E. Henion, 48, who died in Wheatland Sept. 27, were held Sept. 29 at 10 a.m. in the First Christian Church with Pastor Don Moore officiating.

Henion was born Febr. 3, 1936, in Ansley, Neb., the son of Samuel J. and Jessie Henion. He was reared and attended school in Ansley. During his high school years his family moved to Paw Paw, Mich.

He joined the U.S. Marine Corps and upon being discharged returned to the Ansley area. There he worked for the state highway department for several years and there became associated with the Custer Power Company in Broken Bow, Neb.

He and Karen Glendy were married Nov. 2, 1958. The family moved to Wheatland in 1975 where he was associated with the Rural Electric Association until the time of his death.

Survivors include his wife, Karen; two sons: Roger Henion of Casper and John Henion of Wheatland; one daughter, Julie Schnase of Wheatland; three brothers, Harold and Dean Henion, both of Kalamazoo, Mich. and Chet Henion of Sheldon, Neb.; four sisters: Alma Pettis of Broken Bow, Neb., Edith Richards of El Creek, Neb., Dorothy Peterson of Duluth, Minn., and Mary Rager of Kalamazoo, Mich.; also two grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents.
