

HENKE, RAYMOND ALBERT
1853-February 21, 1943

Raymond Albert Henke, 89, who was a resident of the Wheatland community for the past 64 years, died Sunday at the Wheatland hospital, death coming after a brief illness. He made his home of late with a nephew, F.W. Henke.

Mr. Henke, who was born at Schoenlanke, Germany in 1853, came to the United States at the age of 16, and after meeting his brother, Rudolph, in Cheyenne in 1873, settled on Horse Creek, ranching there for two years before moving to Lodge Pole creek. After residing at this ranch for nine years, he located on the South Sybilee, remaining there until 1914 at which time he entered the banking business in Wheatland.

His wife, Julia Plaga, to whom he was married in 1900, preceded him in death in 1936. Surviving are two step-sons, Otto W. Plaga and Albin R. Plaga and several nephews and nieces.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday at one o'clock at the Masonic Temple with Watson-Dennis in charge of arrangements.
